Policy Committee (PC) Meeting Summary

- **I. Call to Order:** Meeting was called to order by J. Peck.
- II. Public Comments: None
- III. Prior Meeting Minutes: The draft minutes from the last PC meeting were circulated and no comments were received. A motion was made by R. Hagemann to accept the prior (5/27/21) meeting minutes. The motion was seconded by K. Reff and passed unanimously.
- IV. Resolution #7 Safety Performance Measures: A motion was made by R. Hagemann to approve Resolution #7-2021, by which the MPO Policy Committee has agreed to support and adopt the NYSDOT's targets for the five Safety performance targets and plan and program projects that contribute to the accomplishment of said targets. The motion was seconded by S. Docteur and passed unanimously. Appendix A Resolution 7-2021 is attached.
- V. Proposed Census Urban Area Definition Change: Member Agencies reported that they had received word that the proposal to change the Urban Area definition was not moving forward.
- VI. Consultant-Planning Services Agreement (PSA): Keith Ewald of B&L gave an update on the three planning studies being conducted under the Planning Services Agreement:
 - Public Safety Building Industrial Park Alternative Access Point Study
 - 2. Bicycle/Pedestrian Connectivity Study
 - 3. City of Watertown Truck Route Study

- VII. Consultant-Planning Services Agreement (PSA) New Task Assignments: NYSDOT is currently accepting applications for the 2021 Round of Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP). Pre-Application submittals are due in August and the Final Applications are due at the end of September. The concept of having B&L prepare TAP applications for two separate extensions of the Black River Trail using the PSA was discussed.
 - 1. A motion was made by R. Hageman and seconded by J. Smith to create a task assignment for B&L to prepare a TAP application for a segment of the Black River Trail east of its current terminus in Black River heading toward Fort Drum. The motion passed unanimously. The Highway Technical Committee will work with B&L in selecting an appropriate segment. Anticipated cost to prepare the application is expected to be in the \$7,500 range. A key issue will be to find a primary sponsor for the application.
 - 2. A motion was made by K. Mix and seconded by J. Smith to create a task assignment for B&L to prepare a TAP application for a westward extension of the Black River Trail toward Sewall's Island. The motion was passed unanimously. The City has the ROW needed to progress this segment.
- **VIII. Personnel/Staffing Changes:** NYSDOT has experienced some personnel changes that will result to changes in the MPO staff.
 - Scott A. Docteur Director, Regional Planning & Program Management, NYSDOT Region 7 & MPO Director has retired and K. Reff will be handling both roles on an interim basis.
 - 2. NYSDOT has recommended that J. Radley replace K. Reff as Local Stakeholders Group Representative. J. Radley is the CHIPS Coordinator for the Region and interacts with the Local Municipalities on a regular basis. A motion was made by K. Mix to approve J. Radley as the Local Stakeholder Group Representative. It was seconded by R. Hagemann and passed unanimously.
 - 3. Alan T. Ricalton NYSDOT Region 7, MPO Central Staff & Highway Technical Committee has retired. B. Cadwell will be taking over his assignment on the MPO Central Staff & Highway Technical Committee along with her position on the Transit Technical Committee.
- **IX.** Adjournment: A motion to adjourn was made by R. Hageman, it was seconded by K. Mix and passed unanimously.

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Resolution 7-2021

Policy Committee Resolution adopting NYSDOT Safety Performance Targets

WHEREAS, the Watertown Jefferson County Area Transportation Council (WJCTC) has been designated by the Governor of the State of New York as the Metropolitan Planning Organization responsible for the comprehensive, continuing, and cooperative transportation planning process for the Watertown Urbanized Area in Jefferson County; and

WHEREAS, the Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) final rule (23 CFR Part 490) requires States to set targets for five safety performance measures annually and

WHEREAS, the New York State Department of Transportation (NYSDOT) has established targets for five performance measures based on five year rolling averages for:

- (1) Number of Fatalities,
- (2) Rate of Fatalities per 100 million Vehicle Miles Traveled (VMT),
- (3) Number of Serious Injuries,
- (4) Rate of Serious Injuries per 100 million VMT, and
- (5) Number of Non-Motorized Fatalities and Non-Motorized Serious Injuries, and

WHEREAS, the NYSDOT coordinated the establishment of safety targets with the 14 Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs) in New York through the New York State Association of Metropolitan

Planning Organizations (NYSAMPO) Safety Working Group and the NYSAMPO Fixing America's Surface Transportation (FAST) Act Working Group; and discussed the targets at a Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) Safety Target Setting Workshop and during an Executive Director's meeting, and

WHEREAS, the NYSDOT has officially adopted the safety targets in the Highway Safety Improvement Program annual report, and the Governors Traffic Safety Committee has adopted identical safety targets for number of fatalities, rate of fatalities and number of serious injuries as set forth in the Highway Safety Strategic Plan (HSSP), and

WHEREAS, the WJCTC may establish safety targets by agreeing to plan and program projects that contribute toward the accomplishment of the aforementioned State's targets, or establish its own target within 180 days of the State establishing and reporting its safety targets,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the MPO Policy Committee has agreed to support NYSDOT's targets for the five safety performance targets as attached herein, and

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Resolution 7-2021

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the MPO Policy Committee will plan and program projects that contribute to the accomplishment of said targets.
